

# Classification of various modules used in the energy storage industry

What are the different types of energy storage systems?

Energy storage systems (ESS) can be widely classified into five main categories: chemical, electrochemical, electrical, mechanical, and thermal energy storage. Chemical energy storage systems are one of these categories.

How to classify energy storage systems?

There are several approaches to classifying energy storage systems. The most common approach is classification according to physical form of energy and basic operating principle: electric (electromagnetic), electrochemical/chemical, mechanical, thermal.

How is an energy storage system (ESS) classified?

An energy storage system (ESS) can be classified based on its methods and applications. Some energy storage methods may be suitable for specific applications, while others can be applied in a wider range of frames. The inclusion of energy storage methods and technologies in various sectors is expected to increase in the future.

How are chemical energy storage systems classified?

Chemical energy storage systems are sometimes classified according to the energy they consume, e.g., as electrochemical energy storage when they consume electrical energy, and as thermochemical energy storage when they consume thermal energy.

How many types of thermal energy storage systems are there?

It was classified into three types, such as sensible heat, latent heat and thermochemical heat storage system (absorption and adsorption system) (65). What are the different types of mechanical energy storage systems?

Mechanical energies are divided into four types: Pumped hydroelectric energy storage, flywheel energy storage, compressed air energy storage, and gravity energy storage.
