Does an RV have hot water?

Your plumbing system has two separate water lines, or pipes, running through the RV, one for cold water and one for hot water.

However, some have an increased capacity, usually in larger RVs. The other style is a tankless water heater, which doesn't store hot water but supplies it on demand.
